Otherwise, send two hard copies and a self-addressed envelope with return postage. All manuscripts are anonymously refereed and should, therefore, contain no obvious reference to the author. The author's name, address, telephone number, and email address should be included on a separate title page. A current subscription to the journal is strongly recommended before the manuscript undergoes the review process.

The *Afro-Hispanic Review* is published twice annually by the Department of Spanish and Portuguese at Vanderbilt University.
